- 2. Set next meeting date.
 - 1 The next scheduled Board of Health meeting will be on Tuesday, October 08, 2019 at 3:00 p.m. This will be a meeting of the full board. The meeting location will be at the Senior's & People with Disabilities building in the Klickitat Room at 3641 Klindt Drive, The Dalles, OR.

 - 1. Nicole Bailey, the Environmental Health Specialist, introduced herself and the new EH trainees.

PUBLIC COMMENT

- 1. Commissioner Steve Kramer
 - 1. Commissioner Kramer has been following the Opioid crisis at the AOC (Association of Oregon Counties) for the last six years.
 - 2. Commissioner Kramer has participated with the Governor's Taskforce on Opioid issues.
 - 3. The "Take Back" bill has been recently passed and will take effect in 2021.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- 1. North Central Public Health office space update.
 - 1. Teri updated the committee on the status of the recent flooding of the east end office space.
 - a) Teri has had no news on the status on the flooding repairs.
 - b) Commissioner Hege had an information update from facilities and the status at this time is that the contractor has been difficult to reach and not following through on the work.
 - 2. Teri updated the committee on the status of the upstairs office space.
 - a) Teri is waiting for some contractors to get back to her so she can obtain further information on costs.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Teri Thalhofer – NCPHD in the news - Opioids in Wasco County

- Teri played a video from Katu news featuring information on the Opioid crisis in Oregon and Wasco County which featured interviews from NCPHD's Jeremy Hawkins and local Sheriff Lane Magill.
- 2. Teri informed the Board on some of the local statistics.
- 3. North Central Public Health is continuing to monitor this issue.
- 4. Teri asked Commissioner Kramer if he would be interested in being connected to the local Opioid Work Group. Teri will contact Dr. Mimi McDonell and find a contact person for this group and let Commissioner Kramer know the contact information.

2. Proposed agenda format change discussion

- 1. Teri gave a handout to each Board attendee and reviewed the new NCPHD agenda format with the board members.
- 2. Teri asked for comments and questions and asked the Board if the group would like to move to the new agenda for the board meetings.
- 3. The Board decided to try the new format and see if it is appropriate.

3. Staff Updates

- 1. Two Environmental Health trainees have been hired. Eric and Paula Grendel have started with North Central Public Health District.
- 2. The Billing Specialist has been hired. Angelica Padilla will be filling this position.
- 3. The WIC Certifier position has been hired and Minarva Craig will be starting soon.
- 4. The Tobacco Prevention & Education Specialist position is now open.
- 5. Modernization Collaborative funding has come in. The funds asked for were \$600,000 and the funds allocated are \$400,000 for the biennium.
 - a) This is a reduction in funding.
 - b) Further discussion with the collaborative will be taking place over the next few weeks to decide on funding throughout the collaborative and how to move forward with the work.

4. Approval of A/P Check Report (August 2019)

- 1. Report presented to the board.
- 2. A motion was made to approve the A/P Check Reports for August 2019 as presented.
- 5. Title X Funding Update Title X is the block grant that supports Family Planning and Reproductive Health Services.
 - 1. Teri updated the board on Oregon Title X funding.
 - 2. Oregon has withdrawn from Title X funding.
 - 3. The current federal administration requires that any state receiving Title X funds must no longer discuss abortion as an option for pregnant clients.
 - 4. Oregon will be replacing the Title X grant moneys with General Fund dollars.
 - 5. There will be no change to NCPHD's services.

6. Review of Contracts

- 1. Oregon Health Authority, Seventeenth Amendment.
 - a) Funding for ACDP Health Equity grant funding 'sharps' disposal and HIV rapid testing; Funding Reproductive Health 9 month award. Funding timing aligning with State biennium.
 - b) Fiscal impact: \$16,703 total.

2. MOU: NCPHD and NORCOR.

- a) Agreement for NCPHD to provide Reproductive Health Services to NORCOR inmates on site.
- b) Fiscal impact: Unknown, but services are newly eligible for reimbursement through Oregon Reproductive Health Program.

- 3. Agreement With Greater Oregon Behavioral Health and Four Rivers Early Learning HUB for a shared position, Family Care Coordinator.
 - a) Agreement with partners to share 1/3 of the cost of an employee to provide Maternal Child Health services and program coordination in Gilliam and Sherman Counties.
 - b) Fiscal Impact: Not to exceed \$30,000.
- 4. OHA IGA for Environmental Health Services.
 - a) Agreement for revised remittance factor for Licensed Facilities. Rate was increased to 17.4%.
 - b) Fiscal Impact: NCPHD Board of Health raised fees to compensate for this increase.
- 5. 2019-2020 Intergovernmental Agreement for the Financing of Public Health Services.
 - a) New biennium agreement for Local Public Health Authority. Includes Program Element Requirements.
 - b) Fiscal Impact: Initial award \$558,183.
- 7. Directors Report by Teri Thalhofer
 - 1. Report presented to the board and feedback was requested.
 - 2. Teri informed the board she would be on vacation September 16th September 23rd. Leadership team will be in charge.

AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES: Agreement between NCPHD and Judy Bankman, an independent contractor. Directors Report for the Board of Health and Staff: October 8, 2019

Greetings Board of Health Members and NCPHD Staff:

September has brought us new staff and continued opportunities to work with community partners.

Mina Craig started as our newest WIC Certifier in September. Mina is a recent MPH graduate from OSU and is excited to begin work in public health practice.

NPCHD Leadership Team continues to travel down the Strategic Planning timeline. SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats) analysis is being completed in each programmatic area. Leadership team will be meeting prior to the Board of Health (BOH) meeting to understand common themes and then will present these to the BOH for input. This is exciting work as we set our strategic direction for the future. We are looking at the themes through the lens of a modernized public health system. This should prepare us well for the changes coming.

NCPHD was awarded dollars for public health modernization both for our regional work with the Eastern Oregon Modernization Collaborative (EOMC) and for our individual efforts. The EOMC Steering Committee has met to discuss priorities and budget and will continue to move forward in the biennium in a collaborative manner. Leadership team will be meeting to discuss the deliverables in the contract for local efforts. Our work plans are due to OHA on October 11, 2019.

September is Preparedness Month and Tanya Wray, our PHEP (Public Health Emergency Preparedness) Coordinator, participated with other community agencies in "Get Ready The Dalles" sponsored by NW Natural.

We continue to work with our CCO partners. In the EOCCO region, we are supportive of the Veggie RX program through the LCAC's and GOBHI. Dr. McDonell has worked with CGCCO partners to secure funding for efforts around childhood obesity and substance use disorder harm reduction. We continue to work closely with 4RELH on Early Childhood efforts including Universally Offered Home Visiting.
