Environmental Health Specialist and Environmental Health Specialist Trainee

North Central Public Health District (NCPHD) is currently hiring for both the Environmental Health Specialist and Environmental Health Specialist Trainee positions.

Environmental Health Specialist (EHS)

Under the supervision of the Environmental Health Specialist Supervisor, the EHS will be independently responsible for soil evaluations, site assessments, inspections, permitting, and compliance assurance for onsite wastewater disposal systems as well as statutory responsibilities for regulating Wasco and Sherman County public drinking water systems. The EHS is also responsible for inspecting temporary and permanent food service establishments, swimming pools and lodging facilities as well as performing other contract inspections and coordinating with state agencies when applicable.

The EHS will hold a minimum of a Bachelor's degree with major coursework in Environmental Science, Environmental Health, Chemistry, Biology, or related science based curriculum and be currently registered as an Environmental Health Specialist in the State of Oregon.

Salary range for this position is \$5,126.70 to \$6,689.20 per month.

Environmental Health Specialist Trainee (EHS Trainee)

EHS Trainees are eligible for a Trainee License as determined by the Environmental Health Registration Board. With coursework meeting the above requirements, but not having obtained the registration, trainees can enter a one to two year program to complete their licensing and registration.

During the trainee process, EHS Trainee will be under close supervision to become versed in practices to complete the duties of an Environmental Health Specialist. Efforts to obtain the proper number of training hours and success in passing the applicable state tests will be supported by NCPHD for the one to two year period trainees are enrolled in the trainee program.

Salary range for this position is \$4,644.66 to \$6,060.23 per month.

Summary:

Individuals in this position perform a variety of survey and investigational duties of an introductory nature in the field and assisting in planning, promoting, and carrying out of programs to secure compliance with public health laws, administrative rules, and policies.

This classification is intended to provide the employee with pertinent training experience to be a Registered Environmental Health Specialist (REHS) as described in Oregon Legislature Chapter 700.

Essential Functions:

- Inspects food service establishments, mobile units, and temporary restaurant events, to ensure compliance with laws and rules; Instructs food handlers on proper food handling procedures and equipment maintenance.
- Conducts site evaluations for the use of standard septic systems and alternative systems; Issues or denies
 permits pursuant to established rules; inspects installations of completed systems for compliance; Investigates
 failing septic systems and assists owners with proper permitting and repair.
- Surveys public drinking water systems; works with operators on sampling compliance.
- Investigates complaints and disease outbreaks concerning food, water, animals, sewage disposal, and communicable disease as required by law and with the assistance of other North Central Public Health District (NCPHD) staff as needed; takes necessary corrective / preventative actions.
- Inspects public pools, motels, and organizational camps to ensure compliance with laws and rules.
- Keeps accurate records of inspection activities.
- Any employee may be required by their manager to perform other duties which may be necessary or desirable and for which the employee is qualified.
- Is to respond to a public health emergency as needed.
- Develop and maintain effective, harmonious and reasonable work relationships with managers, county authorities, employees, and the general public.
- Conflict resolution as needed with mentorship from supervisor.

Qualifications:

- Minimum of a Bachelor's degree with major course work in Environmental Science, Environmental Health, Chemistry, Biology, or related science based curriculum. Experience and education in soil science, desired.
- Must have a valid Driver's License.
- Must be or meet standards of Environmental Health Specialist Trainee as outlined by ORS 700.035.
- Knowledge of county, state, and federal laws, regulations and ordinances governing environmental health and safety programs, including Oregon Health Authority, Food, Pool, and Lodging, and Oregon Department of Environmental Quality statues, regulations and standards.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities:

- To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily. The requirements listed below are representative of the knowledge, skill, and/or ability required.
- Minimum Bachelor's Degree (B.S.) from a four-year college or university program in environmental science or in equivalent basic sciences with a major emphasis in chemistry, biology, social science, physical science, etc.
- Must be able to maintain registration with the Oregon Environmental Health Registration Board as an environmental health specialist trainee or waste water specialist trainee per Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) Chapter 700
- Possession of a valid State of Oregon driver's license with a good driving record. Regular and predictable attendance to work expected.
- Works under general supervision of the Environmental Health Specialist Supervisor who makes work
 assignments and reviews work for effectiveness of programs and for adherence to law and departmental policies
 and procedures.

Work Environment:

The work environment and physical demands here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.
